Allocating verses to chapters, naming and numbering chapters and verses

As groups of verses were revealed, Muhammad was informed by God into which chapter of the Qur'an they should be placed. There are 114 chapters (*suras*) in total. They were given names, by which most Muslims know them, and later numbered. These names might be derived from a particular topic covered in the *sura* (4: Women or 22: The Pilgrimage), or a central character (12: Joseph or 14: Abraham or 19: Mary), or an unusual incident (2: The Cow or 27: The Ant). At a later period, the verses (*ayat*) in each chapter were given numbers for ease of reference. The chapters vary greatly in length from three to 286 verses. About eighty-six *suras* were revealed in Makka (610-622). The remaining twenty-eight were revealed in Madina (622-632).
